Lenten Guidelines

The Catholic Church calls all believers to certain practices that emphasize the communal nature of repentance, especially during the Lenten season:



- Abstinence from meat - This is observed on *Ash Wednesday*, *Good Friday*, and all the *Fridays of Lent* by all Catholics 14 years of age and older.
- Fasting - This is observed on *Ash Wednesday* and *Good Friday* by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- Those who are sick, pregnant, nursing, or whose health would be adversely affected by fasting and abstinence should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

Meditation

I saw Jesus in the usual way, and He spoke these words to me: **Lay your head on My shoulder, rest and regain your strength. I am always with you. Tell the friend of My Heart [Fr. Andrasz] that I use such feeble creatures to carry out My work.** After a while my spirit was strengthened with great power. **Tell him that I had let him see your weakness during your confession to show him what you are of yourself (Diary, 498).**

Fatherless Families

Roe v Wade encouraged an explosion in promiscuity and undoubtedly, abortion has become a form of contraception. Sex without consequences has resulted in fatherless families. At least 20 million American kids are growing up without their fathers in the home. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, 78 % of all African American households were led by married parents in the 1950's and 60's. Today, only 26 % of homes in the African American community are led by married parents. It is no coincidence that this same community has been most devastated by abortion. The social and economic consequences of fatherless families are truly monumental. A child living without a father in the home is 8 times more likely to suffer from maltreatment; suffers over 10 times the rate of abuse, and nearly 8 times the rate of neglect. Similarly, children without fathers in the home are 5 times more likely to live in poverty and twice as likely to drop out of school. They are also at a much higher risk of incarceration, drug use, teenage pregnancy and continuing the cycle of poverty. The main victim of our culture of death is the 3,500 innocent babies who lose their lives each and every day in America. However, there are many other victims including many children born into fatherless homes. As a society, we need to urgently consider how we stop this destructive trend of abandonment. The so-called right to abortion has pitted mothers against their children and women against men. It has sown violence and discord at the heart of the most intimate human relationships. It has aggravated the derogation of the father's role in an increasingly fatherless society. It has portrayed the greatest of gifts—a child—as a competitor, an intrusion, and an inconvenience."



Gospel Reading-March 8, 2026

John 4:5-42

Jesus reveals himself to the Samaritan woman at the well.

In today's Gospel, the dialogue between Jesus and a woman from Samaria is among the most lengthy and most theological found in Scripture. Jesus, an observant Jew of that time, was expected to avoid conversation with women in public. The animosity between the Jews and the Samaritans should have prevented the conversation as well. The woman herself alludes to the break from tradition: "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" Yet Jesus not only converses with the woman, he also asks to share her drinking vessel, an action that makes him unclean according to Jewish law.

With no running water, the daily trip to the well by the women of the community was of paramount importance. The women of the town would have traveled to the well in the early morning, but this woman came to the well at noon, the hottest time of the day, a clear sign that she is an outcast within the Samaritan community. We learn in her conversation with Jesus that she is an outcast because of her "many husbands."

The high point of the conversation is when Jesus reveals himself to her as the Messiah. His answer to the Samaritan woman's questions about worship is meant to predict a time when worshiping in truth and spirit will become the way to worship.

After the conversation, the Samaritan woman becomes a disciple. As an outcast and not a Jew, she returns to her town to lead others to Jesus and to wonder whether she has found the Messiah. The Samaritan townspeople return with her to meet Jesus for themselves, and many are said to come to believe in him.

The significance of the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman has many levels. The first is personal: The woman is herself converted to belief in Jesus as Messiah because he knows her sin but speaks with her just the same. The second is social: Having come to know Jesus as the Messiah, the Samaritan woman becomes an evangelist to her own people. The third level of the story is educational: Jesus uses his encounter with the Samaritan woman to teach his disciples that God's mercy is without limit. The disciples return from their shopping quite confused to find Jesus talking with a Samaritan, and a woman at that! But the conversion of the Samaritan townspeople is a foretaste of the kind of open community that will be created among those who believe that Jesus is the Messiah.
