Lenten Guidelines

The Catholic Church calls all believers to certain practices that emphasize the communal nature of repentance, especially during the Lenten season:



- Abstinence from meat - This is observed on *Ash Wednesday*, *Good Friday*, and all the *Fridays of Lent* by all Catholics 14 years of age and older.
- Fasting - This is observed on *Ash Wednesday* and *Good Friday* by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- Those who are sick, pregnant, nursing, or whose health would be adversely affected by fasting and abstinence should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

From St. Faustina's Diary

Be At Peace

Meditation



I was present at Holy Mass celebrated by Father Sopocko. During the Mass, I saw the Infant Jesus who, touching the priest's forehead with His finger, said to me, **His thought is closely united to Mine, so be at peace about what concerns My work. I will not let him make a mistake, and you should do nothing without his permission.** This filled my soul with great peace as regards everything that has to do with this work (*Diary*, 1408).

Prayer Response

Lord Jesus, thank You for the confidence You expressed in Fr. Sopocko's thoughts being united with Yours. It gave St. Faustina great peace about her work of mercy. May I, too, experience Your peace in proclaiming Your mercy in response to the encouragement of my spiritual director or confessor.

The Silent Scream

Harriet Beecher Stowes 1852 anti-slavery novel helped ignite the abolitionist movement and highlight the evil of slavery. The movie "The Silent Scream" (now in DVD form) has a similar impact in relation to the evil of abortion. Ronald Reagan (who had been pro-choice in his young life) became strongly pro-life as a result of watching "The Silent Scream," a movie he considered so powerful and convicting that he screened it at the White House. Since then, many abortion advocates (including those working in abortion clinics) have changed their minds and become strong advocates for the pre-born as a result of watching this DVD. "When the lives of the unborn are snuffed out, they often feel pain, pain that is long and agonizing." President Ronald Reagan to National Religious Broadcasters Convention, January 1981.

The modern technology of real-time ultrasound now reveals the actual responses of a 12-week old fetus to being aborted. As the unborn child attempts to escape the abortionists suction curette, her motions can be seen to become desperately agitated and her heart rate doubles. Her mouth opens as if to scream, but no sound can be heard. Her scream does not have to remain silent, however-----not if you will become her voice.

Gospel Reading-March 1, 2026

Matthew 17:1-9

Jesus is transfigured on the mountain in the presence of Peter, James, and John.

For the second Sunday of Lent, we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert to his Transfiguration. Each year on the first Sunday of Lent, our Gospel tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert. On the second Sunday of Lent each year, we hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration.

The story of Jesus' Transfiguration is told in the three Synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke. In each of those Gospels, the Transfiguration follows Jesus' first prediction of his death and his teaching about the costs of discipleship. Jesus' Transfiguration is a promise of Jesus' glory, his Resurrection.

On a mountain in today's reading, a voice affirms that Jesus is God's Son in words reminiscent of the voice at Jesus' baptism. In addition, the appearance of Moses and Elijah on the mountain connects this story with God's relationship to the people of Israel. Moses and Elijah represent the Law and the Prophets, respectively. Together with Jesus, they represent God's complete Word.

The Transfiguration occurs in the presence of just three of Jesus' disciples: Peter, James, and John. In Matthew's Gospel, those disciples are among the first whom Jesus calls. The three men are identified as an "inner circle" among Jesus' disciples when Jesus asks them to accompany him to the Garden of Gethsemane just before his arrest.


