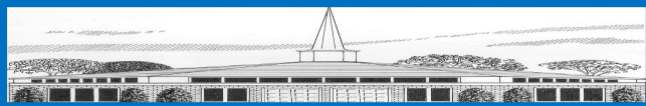

## Gospel Reading Sunday, April 26, 2026

John 10: 1-10

*Jesus is the gate for his sheep.*

This fourth Sunday of the Easter season is sometimes called Good Shepherd Sunday because in each of the three lectionary cycles, the Gospel reading invites us to reflect on Jesus as the Good Shepherd. In each cycle the reading is from the tenth chapter of John's Gospel. This chapter sets the framework for Jesus' teaching about himself as the Good Shepherd.

Today's reading falls between the stories of Jesus' healing of the man born blind and the raising of Lazarus. Both of these stories were proclaimed in the Gospels found in this year's season of Lent. Following the controversy that ensued when Jesus healed the man born blind, Jesus directs his allegory about the sheep and the shepherd toward the Jewish religious leaders of his time, the Pharisees.

Throughout John's Gospel the Pharisees fail to accept Jesus' ministry and teaching. They show themselves to be "robbers and thieves" because they try to lead the sheep without entering through the gate, Jesus. Through these metaphors, Jesus is telling his listeners that those who follow him and his way will find abundant life. He identifies himself both as the shepherd and the gate. The shepherds who are faithful to him are the ones whom the sheep (Jesus' disciples) should follow.

The relationship between the sheep and their shepherd is based on familiarity. Sheep recognize their shepherd and will not follow a stranger. At the end of the day, shepherds lead their sheep from pastures to a common gated area called a sheepfold. There, one shepherd protects all of the sheep until the next day when each shepherd returns to lead his own sheep to pasture. As shepherds move among the sheep, the sheep follow only their shepherd.

Today's Gospel also gives us the opportunity to reflect on Christian leadership. Jesus' words suggest to us that those who will lead the Christian community will be known by their faithfulness to Jesus. The leaders will recognize that Jesus is the gate for all of the sheep and that having a good relationship with Jesus is the primary characteristic of a Christian leader. Jesus' allegory also suggests that faithful Christian leadership requires a good relationship with the community: the shepherd knows his sheep, and they know him. Christian leaders follow the example of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, by being faithful to him and by being a good shepherd.

### **Abortion In Young Women And Subsequent Mental Health**

Most debates on abortion have centered around ethical, religious and other issues concerning the rights of the unborn child in circumstances of an "unplanned pregnancy." However, a recent study in New Zealand focused on the mental health of young women following an abortion.

The study concluded, "Those having an abortion have elevated rates of subsequent mental health problems including depression, anxiety, suicidal behaviors and substance use disorders" (Journal of Child Psychology & Psychiatry).

Advocates of abortion do not like (and invariably ignore) empirical evidence like this. It is not consistent with their rhetoric which often trivializes the expectant mother's life and death decision. Once again, science supports the pro-life position, including the fact that abortion harms women. The serious mental health implications of abortion is biological fact---not religious dogma!

- ◆ Attendance at Holy Mass every week and on Holy Days of Obligation is a requirement of all of us as Catholics. Too many children (and their parents) are not attending Holy Mass regularly. Attending Holy Mass with your children sets a firm foundation for this practice.
- ◆ The first Open Registration date for 2026-2027 RE classes is May 24. Forms and information will be sent to you via email. Earlier registrations are available by appointment.
- ◆ First Holy Communion Practice will take place on Monday, April 27, at 6:00 p.m.
- ◆ First Holy Communion will take place on May 2 at the 4:00 p.m. Holy Mass. The May Crowning will take place on May 3, followed by the Living Rosary and the last RE class for the school year.
- ◆ Parents, please read the letter sent to you explaining upcoming changes to our RE Program.
- ◆ We are looking for RE assistants for next year. Let us know if you are interested! Volunteer teachers and assistants receive a 50% discount on tuition for their children.
  
- ◆ In keeping with the Archdiocese directive of family faith formation, advancing youth ministry and changes to the process of Confirmation, we will implement several adjustments to the RE program at SVdP next year. This will include:
  1. Students who have received First Holy Communion and in Grades 7-12 will meet on Wednesday evenings from 5:45—7:00 p.m.
  2. New students who have reached the age of seven or above and are in need of Baptism and/or First Holy Communion will be placed in a Sacrament Prep class on Sunday mornings which both parent and child must attend.
  3. Four Parent sessions have been inserted into the Religious Education Calendar next year that will introduce parents to Faith Formation in the Home.
  4. For 2026-2027, the Sacrament of Confirmation will remain limited to 10th graders or older. All sacrament Prep classes, including First Holy Communion and Confirmation will require a minimum of two years of formation.

Note: K-6 classes, OCIA for Children, and First Communion classes will continue to meet on Sunday mornings from 10:30—11:15. Classes begin on August 9, 2026. Registration is in person only. Please refer to the Open Session Registration schedule for dates and times. Appointments are always welcome.
