## From St. Faustina's Diary *Jesus Arranged Things*



As I was writing the above words, I saw the Lord Jesus leaning over me, and He asked, **My daughter, what are you writing?** I answered, "I am writing about You, Jesus, ... about Your inconceivable love and mercy for people." And Jesus said, **Secretary of My most profound mystery, know that yours is an exclusive intimacy with Me. Your task is to write down everything that I make known to you about My mercy, for the benefit of those who by reading these things will be comforted in their souls and will have the courage to approach Me. I therefore want you to devote all your free moments to writing.** "But, O Lord, shall I always have a moment, at least a brief one, in which to write?" And Jesus answered, **It is not for you to think about that. Only do as much as you can, and I will always arrange things so that you will easily be able to do what I ask of you ... (Diary, 1693).**

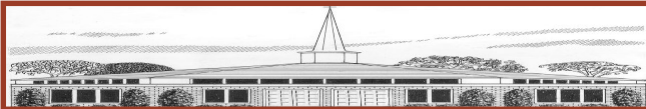

## Gospel Reading—Sunday, November 2, 2025

*John 6: 37-40*

Jesus was good friends with Lazarus and his sisters, Martha and Mary. Lazarus had fallen ill, and Martha and Mary had sent word to Jesus. Jesus delays his journey to them, however, and when he arrives in Bethany, he finds that Lazarus is dead and has been buried for four days.

The scene described at Bethany is a sad one; Lazarus and his family have many friends who have come to mourn his death. Martha goes out to meet Jesus when he arrives. She cries with him, saying that if Jesus had been there, Lazarus would not have died. Yet she remains confident that God will do whatever Jesus asks. Jesus consoles her with the promise that Lazarus would rise from the dead. Martha affirms her belief that there will be resurrection of the dead in the last days. Jesus promises her even more; he says that he himself is the Resurrection and the life for all those who believe in him. Martha professes her faith in this, acknowledging that Jesus is Christ, the Son of God. This is the profession of faith we continue to make, and it is the promise on which we base our hope for eternal life for ourselves and for all those who have died. In his death and Resurrection, Jesus has conquered death for all those who believe in him.

We believe that we continue to share a relationship with those who have died. When we pray for the souls of the faithful departed, we are praying for those whose souls are journeying through purgatory, being prepared for eternal life in heaven. We believe that our prayers for them will help to speed their journey to eternal life with God in heaven.

## "Informed" Consent and Abortion

When you go to the hospital for any medical procedure, you are invariably informed about the procedure, its possible complications, etc. Only then does the patient give "informed" consent.

Abortion is the most frequently performed surgery on adults in America. Yet it is unique in that, while it is surgery that is potentially dangerous to the mother and destroys the human being within her, the mother is not given proper factual information on the surgery, not to mention any details about "what she carries". Indeed, this is one of the most tragic abuses associated with the abortion industry particularly as the abortion clinic has a vested, financial interest to carry out the abortion.

Very little (if any) factual information is given at all, and what is given is often false. The complications are ignored, glossed over, or mentioned on a paper in fine print. The mother's baby is referred to as "pregnancy tissue", "not alive yet", "not a baby yet", "just a bunch of cells", "only a glob". These descriptions are given at a stage of development when the baby already sucks his or her thumb and feels pain, and when we can listen to his/her tiny heartbeat on an office ultrasonic stethoscope.

Such deception of the mother and railroading her into an abortion is never more evident than when the so-called "counselor" asks her, "Do you want your menstrual period re-established? If so, just sign up for this procedure". Abortion is not mentioned, nor is any-thing said about the baby. Abortion is a huge industry, providing enormous profits to providers such as Planned Parenthood. There is no better example of the exploitation of women than this continuing, commercialized, and almost universal deception.

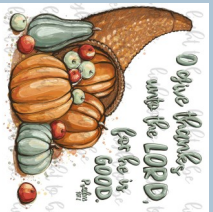
*Let us prepare for the Parish's Renewed Consecration to the Holy Family in the following way by:*

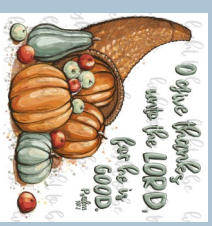


