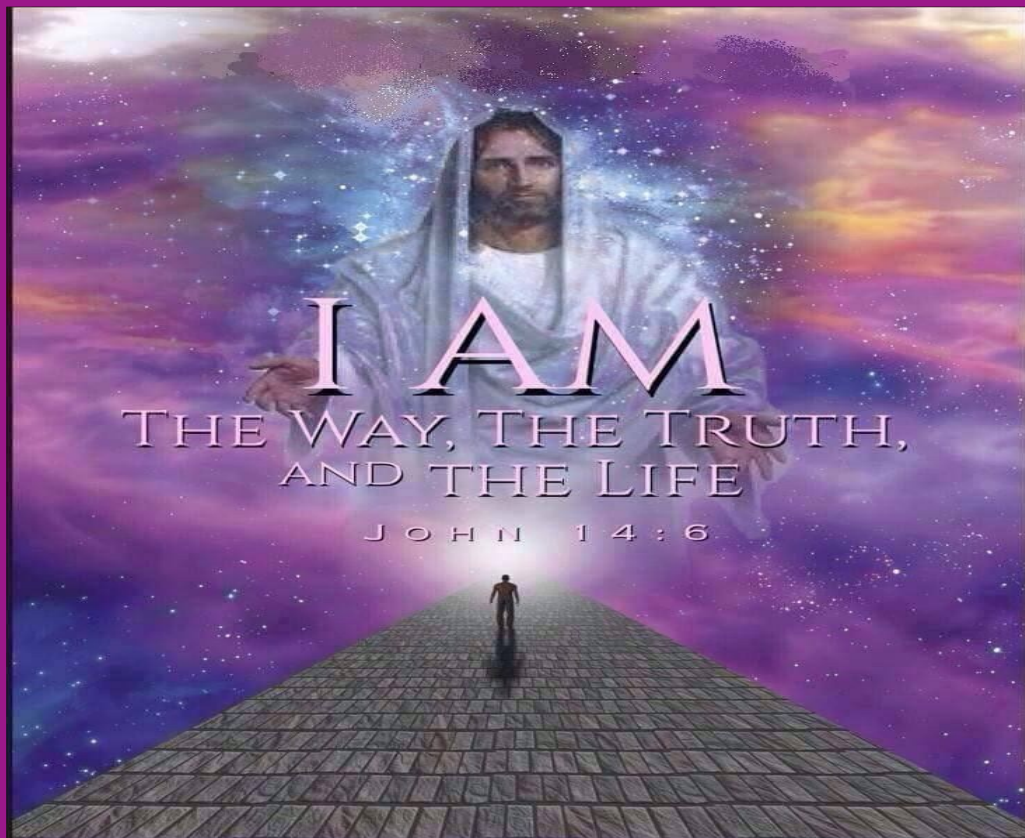

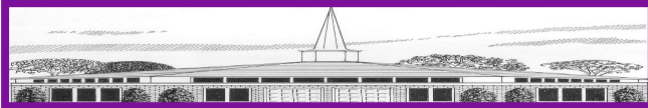

Gospel Reading
Sunday, May 3, 2026
John 14:1-12

Jesus tells his disciples, "I am the way and the truth and the life."

The readings for the last few Sundays have been about the Resurrection, but today's Gospel takes us back in time to an event in Jesus' life before his Passion. Jesus tells his disciples that he is going to prepare a place for them in his Father's house. He promises that where he is going, his disciples will be able to follow. Thomas, who will later doubt the disciples' reports that they have seen the Risen Lord, contradicts Jesus by saying that the disciples don't know where Jesus is going or how to get there. Jesus explains that he himself is the way, the truth, and the life. In knowing and loving Jesus, the disciples now love God the Father.

Philip then makes a request that challenges Jesus' words. Philip wants Jesus to show the Father to the disciples. Recall that Jesus has just told his disciples, "If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him."

As a good teacher, Jesus responds to Philip by repeating and elaborating on what he has just told the disciples: they have seen and known Jesus, so they have seen and known the Father. Then Jesus offers another reassurance about his departure: because of faith in God and in Jesus, the disciples will do the work that Jesus has done and more.

The connection between Jesus and his Father, between Jesus' work and the work of the Father, is made clear in today's Gospel. Jesus is in the Father, and God the Father is in Jesus. As God spoke his name to Moses, "I am," so too Jesus speaks his name to his disciples: "I am the way and the truth and the life."

The revelation of the Trinity is completed in the passage that follows today's reading, and it is the Gospel for next Sunday. Because Jesus goes away, the Father will send in Jesus' name the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who will continue the work of the Father and of Jesus.

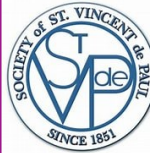
- ◆ Attendance at Holy Mass every week and on Holy Days of Obligation is a requirement of all of us as Catholics. Too many children (and their parents) are not attending Holy Mass regularly. Attending Holy Mass with your children sets a firm foundation for this practice.
- ◆ The first Open Registration date for 2026-2027 RE classes is May 24. Forms and information will be sent to you via email. Earlier registrations are available by appointment.
- ◆ The May Crowning will take place on May 3, followed by the Living Rosary and the last RE class for the school year.
- ◆ Parents, please read the letter sent to you explaining upcoming changes to our RE Program. Let us know if you have any questions or concerns.
- ◆ We are looking for RE assistants for next year. Let us know if you are interested! Volunteer teachers and assistants receive a 50% discount on tuition for their children.
- ◆ In keeping with the Archdiocese directive of family faith formation, advancing youth ministry and changes to the process of Confirmation, we will implement several adjustments to the RE program at SVdP next year. This will include:

1. Students who have received First Holy Communion and in Grades 7-12 will meet on Wednesday evenings from 5:45—7:00 p.m.
2. New students who have reached the age of seven or above and are in need of Baptism and/or First Holy Communion will be placed in a Sacrament Prep class on Sunday mornings. The child and a parent must both attend the class.
3. Four Parent sessions have been included in the Religious Education Calendar next year to introduce parents to Faith Formation in the Home.
4. For 2026-2027, the Sacrament of Confirmation will remain limited to 10th graders or older. All sacrament Prep classes, including First Holy Communion and Confirmation, will require a minimum of two years of formation.

Note: For the 2026-2027 School Year, K-6 classes, OCIA for Children, and First Communion classes will continue to meet on Sunday mornings from 10:30—11:15.

Classes begin on August 9, 2026. Registration is in person only. Please refer to the Open Session Registration schedule for dates and times.

Appointments are always welcome. Please contact the RE office to schedule an appointment if needed.

1 Timothy 2:1-2

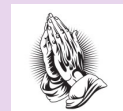
“I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions... be made for all men; for kings, and for all that are in authority.”

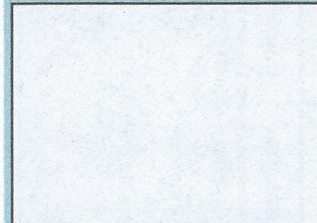
