Gospel Reading - March 10

John 3:14-21

Jesus tells Nicodemus that the Son of Man will be raised up so that those who believe in him will have eternal life.

Today's Gospel reading is taken from John's Gospel. It consists of two parts. The first part is the final sentence of Jesus' reply to Nicodemus, the Pharisee who approached Jesus at night. Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus as someone who had come from God and seemed to want to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus greeted Nicodemus with the observation that one must be born from above to see the Kingdom of God. The dialogue between Jesus and Nicodemus that followed was about the meaning of this phrase. Nicodemus misunderstood Jesus at every point, but there was no animosity in the questions he posed to Jesus.

In the part of the conversation with Nicodemus in today's Gospel, Jesus referred to an incident reported in the Old Testament. When the Israelites grumbled against the Lord during their sojourn in the desert, God sent venomous serpents to punish them for their complaints. The Israelites repented and asked Moses to pray for them. The Lord heard Moses' prayer and instructed him to make a bronze serpent and mount it on a pole. All who had been bitten by a serpent and then looked upon the bronze serpent were cured. By recalling this story, Jesus alludes to the salvation that would be accomplished through his death and Resurrection.

The second part of today's Gospel is a theological reflection on Jesus' words to Nicodemus. The Gospel of John is known for this kind of reflection offered within the narrative. The words of the Evangelist are in continuity with the words of the prologue to John's Gospel. In these reflections, John elaborates on a number of themes that are found in his Gospel: light and darkness, belief and unbelief, good and evil, salvation and condemnation.

In John's reflection, we find an observation about human sinfulness. Jesus is the light that has come into the world, but people preferred the darkness. We wish to keep our sins hidden, even from God. Jesus has come into the world to reveal our sins so that they may be forgiven. This is the Good News; it is the reason for our rejoicing in this season of Lent and throughout our lives.

Lenten Guidelines

The Catholic Church calls all believers to certain practices that emphasize the communal nature of repentance, especially during the Lenten season:

- Abstinence from meat This is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older.
- Fasting This is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- Those who are sick, pregnant, nursing, or whose health would be adversely affected by fasting and abstinence should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

The Pain Suffered by the Aborted Baby

Proponents of abortion are determined to make sure that the grizzly truths regarding abortion are suppressed and are not revealed to the public and most importantly to pregnant mothers. One of these facts is the overwhelming medical evidence that the child in the mother's womb feels pain when he or she is aborted. The U. S. House of Representatives has considered legislation to redress this, such as "The Unborn Child Pain Awareness Act" such legislation would ensure that a woman was informed of the pain her unborn baby feels when he or she is aborted. Also, the legislation would have required that the woman considering an abortion expressly request or refuse anesthesia for her baby (to subdue the pain).

Tragically, these humane initiatives have failed. It is abundantly clear that abortion supporters want expectant mothers to be ignorant and uninformed. This relates to all aspects of abortion including the medical procedure and its risks, the likely psychological and emotional repercussions to the mother and the pain endured by her child.

Women deserve the truth, but the defeat of such legislation helps keep expectant mothers (and society generally) in the dark. "It is imperative we take appropriate measures to inform every woman who is seeking an abortion of the development of the unborn child to feel pain in her womb We have taken action to ensure that the pain of livestock and laboratory animals is reduced and prevented yet amazingly when it comes to the unborn child, we hesitate." - Representative Virginia Foxx (R-NC)
