Note: Baptisms are not scheduled to take place during Lent.



Lenten Guidelines The Catholic Church calls all believers to certain practices



that emphasize the communal nature of repentance, especially during the Lenten season:

- Abstinence from meat This is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older.
- Fasting This is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- Those who are sick, pregnant, nursing, or whose health would be adversely affected by fasting and abstinence should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

Lent is a season of penance, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. During Lent, we are all called to embrace penances and to perform works of charity that reflect our desire for conversion of heart. May this Lent lead us all to a deeper union in Christ and with one another.

Basket for Palms

A basket has been placed in the Narthex to collect blessed palms that were distributed

last year on Palm Sunday. Please make every effort to return them so that they may be reverently burned or buried.

Wednesday Holy Mass:

Wednesday Holy Masses during Lent are celebrated at 12 noon. Adoration will take place, and confessions will be heard, immediately following Holy Mass.

Gospel for Sunday February 26



Matthew 4:1-11

Jesus fasts for 40 days in the desert and is tempted by the devil.



In Matthew, as in Luke, the devil presents three temptations to Jesus. The devil tempts Jesus to use his power to appease his hunger; he tempts Jesus to put God's promise of protection to the test; and he offers Jesus all of the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will worship the devil. In each case, Jesus resists the temptation, rebuking the devil with words from Scripture.

The account of Jesus' temptation in the desert is filled with allusions and parallels to the Old Testament, including the story of the people of Israel. The Israelites spent 40 years wandering in the desert in Exodus, for example, and Jesus spends 40 days in the desert. As the Israelites were tempted during the Exodus, so too is Jesus tempted.

Each temptation offers insight into both God and the human condition. Jesus' rejection of the temptations shows that he will not put God to the test. Grounding himself on the word and authority of Scripture, Jesus rebukes the devil, confident in God's protection and faithfulness.

As we start our journey through Lent, our Sunday readings call us to adopt the same confidence that Jesus had in the face of temptation: God's word alone will suffice; God's promise of protection can be trusted; God alone is God.


