Lenten Guidelines—The Catholic Church calls all believers to certain practices that emphasize the communal nature of repentance, especially during the Lenten season:

- Abstinence from meat - This is observed on **Ash Wednesday**, **Good Friday**, and all the **Fridays of Lent** by all Catholics 14 years of age and older.
- Fasting - This is observed on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- Those who are sick, pregnant, nursing, or whose health would be adversely affected by fasting and abstinence should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

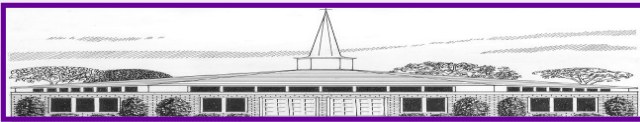

Gospel Reading Sunday, March 23, 2025

Luke 13: 1-9

Galileans were Jews from Galilee, a region north of Judea. Here they seem to have traveled south to sacrifice animals in the Jerusalem temple. For reasons now unknown to us, Pontius Pilate, the Roman administrator of Judea, had them killed.

Siloam was a section of ancient Jerusalem. In the Gospel of John we learn that the area was trenched to hold water. It seems that a section of a tower built into the wall that enclosed the city collapsed, killing the people inside it.

Jesus makes it clear that neither of the two groups of people deserved to die any more or less than his listeners. Death simply caught them off-guard. Jesus draws from these terrible circumstances to make the broader point that people should change their lives now, while there is still time.

More specifically, people should accept that Jesus is bringing about God's kingdom and they should conform their lives to God's rule while there is still time. Those who deny that God is establishing His reign through Jesus will ultimately be excluded from salvation.

The fig tree parable clarifies the meaning of verses 1-5. People are given time to repent, but that time will eventually end. This is the main point of the parable, but it is not the only meaning to draw from it. Parables invite reflection and discussion because they do not mean only one thing.

Pro-Life Answers to False Pro-Choice Arguments (Part XII)
"The fetus may be human, but it is not "viable" without the mother"



Pro-abortion advocates increasingly have to admit that the unborn child is a human being (because they otherwise deny science) but they argue that the so-called "fetus" has no right to life because he/she is not "viable" and is dependent upon the mother. For the reasons outlined below, this argument has no merit, but if they were sincere in this view, they would at least support a limit being placed on abortions after the twenty second week of gestation, when the child can survive outside the mother's womb. Of course, they do not support such a restriction.

If the issue is that the unborn are not viable because they are dependent upon another individual in order to survive, that does not end at birth. By this standard, a two-year-old baby is no more viable than an unborn baby. In fact, if the guiding principle to the right to life is the ability to survive without others, many people in society would not be "viable" such as the handicapped and the aged. So why would this cruel and illogical "viability" standard only apply to the unborn.

Moreover, science has now produced proof that human beings are actually viable from the moment of conception. Because of invitro-fertilization (IVF), we now know that even at its earliest stages, human life is capable of surviving outside the womb, if given the proper environment. With IVF, the fertilized egg (or child) spends the first few days in a petri dish and is only placed inside the mother because medical science has not yet developed a substitute for the womb.

In other words, the viability issue is yet another smoke-screen because it is a function of medical technology and is wholly unrelated to the humanity of the child. That is further proven by the fact that premature babies are now routinely surviving at gestational ages that would have been unthinkable even 20 years ago (although children are biologically the same as ever).

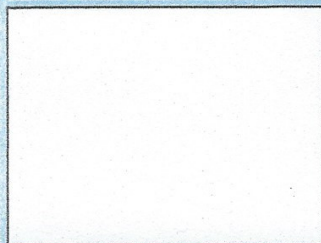




