

Eucharistic Revival The Holy Spirit and the Eucharist Jesus and the Holy Spirit



...he acts, speaks and rejoices in the Spirit (cf. *Luke* 10:21), and he can offer himself in the Spirit (cf. *Hebrews* 9-14). In the so-called "farewell discourse" reported by John, Jesus clearly relates the gift of his life in the paschal mystery to the gift of the Spirit to his own (cf. *John* 16:7). Once risen, bearing in his flesh the signs of the passion, he can pour out the spirit upon them (cf. *John* 20:22), making them sharers in his own mission (cf. *John* 20:21). The Spirit would then teach the disciples all things and bring to their remembrance all that Christ had said (cf. *John* 14:26).

Preparation for the Consecration to the Holy Family

Dearest Heavenly Father, Father of mercies, your Only Begotten Son, as He hung upon the Cross, chose the Blessed Virgin Mary, His Mother, to be our Mother also. Grant, we pray, that with her loving help, and that of her most chaste spouse, Saint Joseph, we may humbly and prayerfully prepare ourselves as the parish of St. Vincent de Paul, for consecration to the Holy Family. We humbly make our prayer in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

Let us prepare for the Parish's Consecration to the Holy Family.

This will take place in the following way:

Columbus Faith in Action Program.*





Gospel for Sunday November 13

Luke 21:5-19



Jesus predicts the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem and warns his followers that persecution will come before the end time.

In the context of Luke, today's Gospel appears near the end of Jesus' teaching in Jerusalem, just prior to the events that will lead to his crucifixion. His warnings and predictions are ominous but can be read in many ways.

To those who first heard Luke's Gospel, those may have been words of encouragement. The destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem by the Romans was history (70 A.D.); Luke's Gospel, Catholic scholars propose, was written between 80 and 90 A.D. His audience was probably Gentile Christians. Luke here tries to interpret the fall of Jerusalem for them and to locate it in God's plans for humankind (salvation history). At the same time, Luke is suggesting to his audience that there will be a considerable elapse of time before Jesus' final coming. Luke's listeners have likely seen much upheaval and are anxious to know if these are the signs of Jesus' coming. Luke is urging greater patience.

In the second part of today's Gospel, Jesus warns that his followers will face persecution for their beliefs. Luke presents persecution as an opportunity for the followers of Jesus for "It will lead to your giving testimony" (Luke 21:13). In persecution God's wisdom and power will be shown in the example of followers of Jesus. Perseverance in the face of persecution will lead to their salvation. Here Jesus is assuring his followers that God is present to all believers, even in times of trouble. Ultimately, Jesus will witness to this with his own death. As disciples of Jesus, we try to follow his example, trusting in God's mercy and protection, even when we are facing difficulties.

"I am fearfully, wonderfully made" – The Unborn

Already some 26 states have enacted laws to prohibit abortion and hopefully many more will follow their example. At a national and every state level there are laws that condemn killing human beings which the unborn are. Recognizing the personhood of each unborn, demands that no government, no state would act contrary to this legal fact prohibiting the killing of an innocent person, which is a crime. Sadly, at a presidential level, and many state levels there are efforts that want to undo the divine and natural law which says, you shall not kill. And many still falsely promote the evil of abortion as healthcare for women.

Our own president is considering declaring abortion a public health emergency. The speaker of the house is trying to enshrine abortion on demand in federal law. We bishops and all pro-lifers must send an unmistakable message to these pro-abortion leaders that we will never let these horrible death plans be enacted. Abortion is the opposite of women's healthcare and is an extreme violation of human rights that come from God. Medicine is to be an act of mercy but abortion in effect falsely says it is brutal killing in the name of mercy.

Those who espouse the chant, "my body, my choice" need to carefully understand what is stated already that a new human life begins at conception which both mother and father should lovingly respect. There is now "another body" with an eternal soul in the mother's womb, distinct from the mother with a complete DNA for life, but yes dependent on a mother's love and care for nourishment, care, and protection. This little one shouts out, "I am fearfully, wonderfully made". The "choice" to be made is before conception not once the life of a tiny person begins.

For a mere human to claim as a human right to destroy this tiny person usurps divine authority and demeans the loving care of our God and creator who carefully and tenderly knits each child in a mother's womb. Personhood of the unborn is the fundamental issue along with the true meaning of motherhood as the abortion discussion continues.

Now the urgent issue for all pro-lifers, beginning with the bishops, is to show more concern for all women who are struggling with a pregnancy issue. Pope Francis stresses the closeness, the compassion and tenderness we must have for all pregnant women and those considering an abortion decision and offer them spiritual, human, social and financial means to assist them with their many needs and to encourage them to save their babies. For unborn babies, living boys and girls, people do not have to be religious to recognize that it has been our logic, our constant biblical belief and now with scientific proof and the constant teaching of our Catholic church that a human being begins at conception.
